

GENERAL SCHOOL REGULATIONS

Changes effective 8/11/16

The discipline policy has changed and the student planners will need to be updated to reflect the changes. Updated policies are listed below with planner pages referenced. Please become familiar with the policy.

1. Ipods, Cell Phones, etc.

a. Page 2, #1

b. **Point of emphasis-** All phones and electronic devices must be turned off when the 1st bell rings for the day. Students may NOT be on the phone during the day.

c. **Consequences Change:**

1st & 2nd Offense: Student must pay \$5 and pick up phone @ the end of the day. Parent will be notified.

3rd Offense: Phone or electronic device confiscated until a parent can pick it up. Student assigned to Detention.

4th Offense: Phone will be kept until the end of the school year. Student will be sent to clinic.

2. Outside Food or Drink

a. Page 2, #10

b. **Point of Emphasis-** Students ARE NOT allowed to bring food or drinks onto the campus from area vendors. These items will be confiscated.

c. A student may bring their own lunch to school. However, no food or drink may be brought to a student during the day.

3. Dress Code

a. Page 3, addition to handbook

b. **Point of Emphasis-** A student out of dress code before school will be sent to the front office to correct the infraction before the first bell rings.

c. **Consequence Change for both Dress Code and ID Violations (Page 4):**

2-3 violations- Student assigned to Detention

4-5 violations- Student assigned to Clinic

6th violation- Suspension (After three suspensions, and expulsion can be recommended)

4. ID

a. Page 4, addition to handbook

b. **Point of Emphasis**

i. Students must wear their school ID on a lanyard and it must be displayed above the waist.

ii. If a student comes on campus without an ID, they will be sent to the office to purchase a temporary ID for \$1 before school without penalty of infraction.

iii. If a student goes through the lunch line without an ID, they will be sent to the office to purchase a temporary ID for \$1 and they will receive an infraction.

iv. Once the 1st bell rings any student without an ID at any time during the school day must purchase a temporary ID for \$1 and they will receive an infraction.

c. Consequence Change for both Dress Code and ID Violations (Page 4):

2-3 violations- Student assigned to Detention

4-5 violations- Student assigned to Clinic

6th violation- Suspension (After three suspensions, and expulsion can be recommended)

d. At any time a student may purchase a new ID for \$5.

5. Tardies

a. p. 4

b. Consequences **Please note this is a MAJOR change in the tardy infraction consequences.

2-3 Violations- Student assigned to Detention

4-5 Violations- Student assigned to Clinic

6 Violations: Suspension (After three suspensions, expulsion can be recommended.)

6. Detention Changes

a. Page 5

b. Consequences

If a student misses Detention, they will be sent to clinic.

After three clinics (for any reason), a student will be suspended.

After three suspensions, a hearing will be held to determine if an expulsion is recommended.
